【備註】

- 14 credits of general education curriculum are “AI and Programming Language”(1 credits), “Exploring Sustainability”(1 credits), at least 1 course selected from 3 main fields(6 credits) and 6 credits of any disciplines from 3 main fields. Select up to two courses from each discipline, and courses that are repeated selected will not be counted toward graduation credits.
- Only elective courses offered by Division of French are recognized as department elective credits. (Courses not announced by Division of French as approved electives will not be counted as department elective credits toward graduation.)
- Students may choose any language for Foreign Language I and II, but both semesters must be in the same language for the credits to count toward graduation.
- Prerequisite courses : For French Conversation, French Grammar, and French Reading & Writing: Starting from the second semester of the first year, students who score below 50 may not continue to the following semester of the course. Students who retake the course must achieve a passing grade of 60 or above to receive credit for the subject.
- Students must upload a copy of the passing certificate for the French proficiency test(DELF) to the system by themselves and bring the original certificate to the department office for verification. (Please handle this procedure at the department office starting from the third year.)

Remarks:

2. Advanced French courses are only for fourth-year students who have not yet passed the DELF B1 French proficiency graduation requirement. Enrollment is done by prior certification and manual add/drop process and cannot be selected through the course registration system.
3. The fourth-year "Corporate Internship" is a full-time off-campus internship course.
